#### Winter-"Eyes"

During the winter months many patients complain that their eyes feel uncommonly dry and irritated. This condition may be caused by the drying effects of indoor heat and the lack of humidity in the outside air. Relief is usually accomplished with the use of over-the-counter lubricating eye drops such as Systane and Refresh Plus. When these artificial tears are not sufficient for relief, a supplement called HYDROEYE or a prescription medication such as Restasis, may be necessary to repair your tear film. Please ask your doctor about these solutions for dry eye.

## Ask The Doctor: Alexander Llinas, M.D., Ph.D.

What is Glaucoma and how do I know if I have it?

"Glaucoma is a disease of the eye that causes a buildup of pressure inside the eye. There are many types of glaucoma, but the two most common are due to a blockage of the drainage system due to cataracts or a breakdown of the drainage system itself. These conditions are more common in people over the age of 45 and are treated with drops or surgery or both. There

may be no symptoms until the vision is permanently lost, which is why it is important to have your eye, or intraocular, pressure checked annually, especially if you have a family history of Glaucoma and/or cataracts."

Signs of Cataract progression are trouble driving at night, especially in the rain, glare and halos around lights, decreased reading vision, or a "film" over your vision. If you are

experiencing any of these symptoms it might be time to learn more about cataract surgery.

Even patients who have mild cataracts, without symptoms may be eligible for refractive cataract surgery.

# Spotlight: Selective Laser Trabeculoplasty: Glaucoma treatment may eliminate the need for drops

Glaucoma is a chronic condition that is generally treated with eye drops. These drops can be very expensive, even with a prescription plan. Compliance can also be a problem as patients may forget to

use their drops or have trouble administering them. A laser procedure called SLT can lower the pressure without the need for long term medication or multiple medications. The procedure is

painless and is performed in our office. If you have Glaucoma and would like to reduce or eliminate the need for eye drops, please ask to be evaluated for SLT.
